

MEMBERSHIP

ASPHO is at the heart of the pediatric hematology/oncology field, with membership reaching 1,960 in 2015. Membership included 362 trainees in first through fifth years, 46 allied healthcare professionals, as well as 154 members from outside the United States.

Top priorities of the Board in 2015 included advocating for improvements to the Maintenance of Certification requirements for physician subspecialists and continued study of workforce trends affecting the pediatric hematology/oncology profession.




